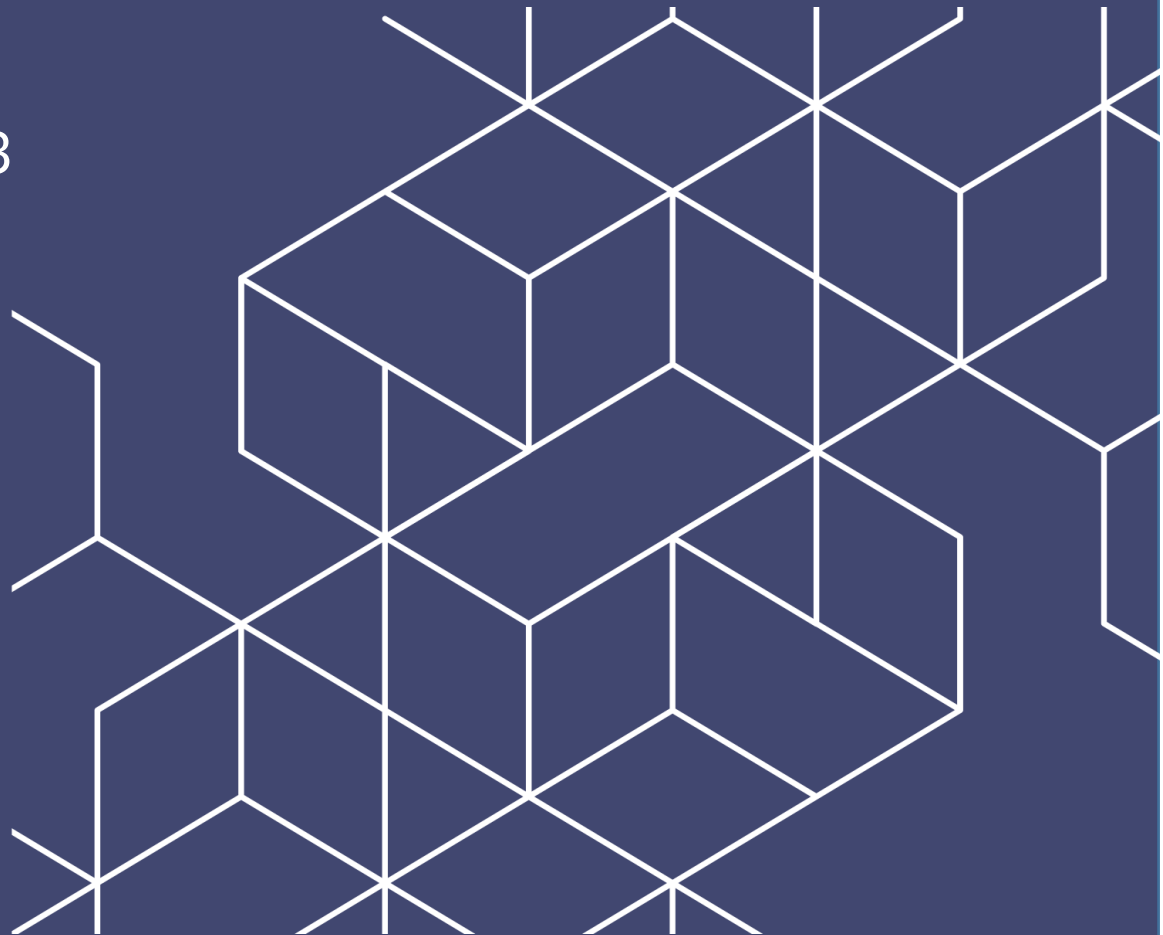

eCASE Investigations 5.2.0 Release Notes

New Features

The following new features were added to the latest eCASE Investigations release:

| ID | Feature | Description |
|-------|-------------------------------------|--|
| 24810 | Index Import Landing | After completing an Index Import, a new “Indexes” option appears. When clicked, the user is taken to the Indexes section of the C/P/I tab. |
| 24910 | Required Evidence Fields | Evidence items in an evidence case folder can now be saved without completing the “Date of Receipt,” “Location Seized,” and “Seized From” fields. |
| 24928 | Outreach Time and Cost Tracking | Added the ability to track time and cost associated with Outreach activities for C/P/I case types. Costs for outreach are added via the “Case Cost” tab within the Outreach case folder. |
| 24983 | Evidence Item Numbering | When agents create Evidence items, the “Item Number” field is editable. This number is automatically populated based on the “Search Site” but can now be edited. Additionally, the “Log Number” field now populates based on the overall count of evidence items and is no longer tied to the “Item Number.” |
| 25103 | Investigations Closure Requirements | Updated the Investigation Close form so if the case status is set to "Investigation Complete" and all questions are answered, the agent can select the "Submit Close Request" option without needing to input a value in the "Reason for Closing" field. |



Bug Fixes

The following bug fixes were applied in the latest version of eCASE Investigations:

| ID | Description |
|-------|--|
| 25191 | Fixed an issue where adding child attachments after a parent attachment was approved caused the child attachments to incorrectly copy fields from the parent. |
| 25207 | Fixed an Evidence issue where the “Receiving Agent” field was incorrectly updated to the Disapprover user while processing the evidence workflow. |
| 25452 | Fixed an issue where converting cases from Preliminary to Investigations caused some child attachments to incorrectly inherit properties from the parent attachment. |
